FEMALE Body: ground color greenish-yellow, less black.

Habitat: Small spring-fed streams w/ sand, gravel, or silt substrate. NJ: rocky streams w/ some silt below impoundment. Stream exposed to sun w/ Spaganium floating leaves (RO). Stream clear/free flowing (Del). Prefers shade.

Reproduction: M patrol slowly 1-2' above water. F oviposit alone, dropping eggs into mid-stream clumps of grasses or sedges. Exuviae on stream banks in vegetation near edge of water; emerge early to mid-morning.
